Course Overview

This course provides the student with information on tactics, strategies, and scene management for multi-casualty incidents, hazardous materials incidents, and wildland fires. Each student also has the opportunity to increase his or her knowledge and skills by handling initial operations at these types of incidents through simulation and class activities.

Course Objectives

To provide students with:

- Information in which to direct the initial operations of a multi-casualty incident.
- Information in which to direct the initial operations of a hazardous materials incident.
- Information in which to direct the initial operations of a wildland fire incident.
- The opportunity to demonstrate the knowledge and skills learned in handling initial operations at hazardous materials, wildland fire, and multi-casualty incidents through simulation and class activities.

Your Instructor: Stewart Roth – Chief Roth currently serves as a Division Chief with the Monterey Fire Department and has been a student of this great profession for over 34 years, starting his career as a Student Fire Fighter. He has worked his way up the ranks including Engineer, Captain, and Battalion Chief. As a Division Chief, he spent 13 years in Training / Safety and Special Operations as both an Operations Chief for Monterey County US&R team and now as a Plans Team Manager and Safety Officer for California Urban Search and Rescue Task Force 3. Chief Roth is currently assigned to the Operations Division where he manages a shift and operational and emergency activities. Stew has been instructor with the Monterey Peninsula College Fire Science Program for over 30 years where he lectures in their Chief Officer Command and Leadership Programs.
