Description: This course is designed to train Fire, Law Enforcement, and EMS command staff from all backgrounds and agencies how to respond, integrate, and mitigate an incident of mass violence. Emphasis is placed on discussion based learning designed to provide students with the maximum amount of tabletop exercise and scenario practice. Fire, Law, and EMS commanders will remain integrated during coursework throughout the day.

Schedule: Each day will begin with morning lecture reviewing mass violence response, pertinent case studies, and review of incident priorities for both fire and law response.

Following lecture, students will participate in tabletop scenarios as a team, reviewing and discussing response methods in a scenario-based format.

In the afternoon, command students will be placed in leadership roles during full scale exercises alongside line personnel where they will be able to hone their command abilities in a realistic response environment.

Class runs each day from 0800 to 1800.
